Ffigurau Covid-19

Mae lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru wedi cyhoeddi bod 8 o achosion newydd o'r coronafeirws wedi'i gadarnhau yng Nghymru, gan ddod â chyfanswm yr achosion i 15,898 a dim un achos newydd ym Mhowys. Cyfanswm yr achosion yn y sir yw 302, er mae'r ffigur hwnnw'n debygol o fod yn llawer uwch.

Yn ôl ffigurau a gyhoeddwyd gan y Swyddfa Ystadegau Gwladol ar nifer y rhai fu farw ym Mhowys o ganlyniad i'r COVID-19 neu'n rhannol ar 19 Mehefin oedd 92 – 46 mewn cartrefi gofal, 37 mewn ysbytai a naw gartref.

O ddiwedd 6 Gorffennaf, dynodwyd 33 o achosion positif ar gyfer Olrhain Cysylltiadau a llwyddwyd i olrhain y cysylltiadau i gyd. Mae hyn wedi arwain at nodi 48 o gysylltiadau. Rhoddwyd cyngor a chanllawiau priodol ar hunan-ynysu i'r holl gysylltiadau hyn.

Wrth i fannau agored Cymru baratoi i groesawu ymwelwyr o ddydd Llun ymlaen, mae'r Prif Weinidog Mark Drakeford yn pwysu ar bobl fydd yn ymweld â chefn gwlad, traethau a mannau hardd Cymru i fod yn ddiogel.

Cafodd y gofyn i aros yn lleol ei godi heddiw gan ganiatáu i bobl deithio yng Nghymru ac i Gymru. Bydd atyniadau ymwelwyr yn yr awyr agored hefyd yn gallu agor a bydd hefyd yn gam tuag at ail-agor y sector twristiaeth o'r 11 Gorffennaf, os yw'r amodau'n caniatáu hynny.

Mae Llywodraeth Cymru'n gweithio gydag awdurdodau lleol, Parciau Cenedlaethol, Cyfoeth Naturiol Cymru a pherchenogion tir eraill i sicrhau bod mannau agored bendigedig Cymru'n barod i groesawu ymwelwyr. Mae hyn yn cynnwys cyhoeddi canllawiau ar dai bach cyhoeddus sy'n canolbwyntio hylendid, cadw pellter, arwyddion, a chiwio. Covid-19 figures

Public Health Wales has reported a further 8 new confirmed cases of coronavirus in Wales, bringing the total number of cases to 15,898, with no new cases in Powys, the total for the county stands at 302 cases although the figure is likely to be much higher.

Figures issued by the Office of National Statistics (ONS) on the number of deaths in Powys attributed, either wholly or in part to COVID-19, as at June 19 was 92 – 46 in care homes, 37 in hospital and nine at home.

As of the end of 6 July there have been 33 positive cases identified for Contact Tracing all of which have all been successfully Contact Traced. This has led to the identification of 48 contacts. Appropriate self-isolation advice and guidance has been provided to all such contacts.

As outdoor spaces in Wales prepare to welcome visitors from Monday, First Minister Mark Drakeford has urged people visiting the countryside, beaches and beauty spots to do so safely.

The requirement to stay local was lifted today enabling people to travel in Wales and into Wales. It will also mean outdoor visitor attractions can open and it will pave the way for the tourism sector to begin re-opening from 11 July, if conditions allow.

The Welsh Government has been working with local authorities, national parks, Natural Resources Wales and other landowners to ensure Wales' wonderful outdoors are ready to welcome visitors. This includes new guidance about public toilets, focusing on hygiene, social distancing, signage and queuing. Not all public toilets, however, will be safe to re-open so people are being advised to check in advance what facilities will be open. <https://gov.wales/first-minister-asks-people-visit-wales-safely>
