Ffigyrau Covid-19

Mae Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru wedi cyhoeddi bod 293 achos newydd o'r coronafeirws wedi'u cadarnhau yng Nghymru ar 15 Medi, gan ddod â chyfanswm yr achosion i **19,681**. Cyfanswm yr achosion ym Mhowys ar 15 Medi yw **451**, sef cynnydd o bedwar ers dydd Llun, er mae'r ffigwr hwnnw'n debygol o fod yn llawer uwch.

Yn ôl ffigurau a gyhoeddwyd gan y Swyddfa Ystadegau Gwladol ar nifer yr rhai fu farw ym Mhowys o ganlyniad i'r COVID-19 neu'n rhannol ar 28 Awst oedd 95 – 48 mewn cartrefi gofal, 38 mewn ysbytai a naw gartref – dim cynnydd ar y ffigurau blaenorol.

Ers dechrau'r rhaglen Profi, Olrhain a Diogelu ar 1 Mehefin a than ddiwedd 15 Medi, cafwyd 196 achos positif ar gyfer Olrhain Cysylltiadau. Mae'r rhain yn cael eu galw'n "achosion cyfeirio". Llwyddwyd i olrhain y cysylltiadau i gyd gan arwain at nodi 565 o gysylltiadau hyd yma. Rhoddwyd cyngor a chanllawiau priodol ar hunan-ynysu i'r holl gysylltiadau.

Covid-19 figures

Public Health Wales has reported as of 15 September a further 293 new confirmed cases of coronavirus in Wales since Monday, bringing the total number of cases to **19,681**. The total number of cases for Powys as at 15 September stands at **451** an increase of four since Monday, although the figure is likely to be much higher.

Figures issued by the Office of National Statistics (ONS) on the number of deaths in Powys attributed, either wholly or in part to COVID-19, as at 28 August was 95 – 48 in care homes, 38 in hospital and nine at home – no increase on previous figure.

Since the commencement of the Test Trace and Protect (TTP) programme on 1 June and up to the end of 15 September, we have identified 196 positive test results that are appropriate for Contact Tracing. These are so called "index cases". Those cases have all been successfully contact traced and this has led to the identification of 565 contacts to date. Appropriate self-isolation advice and guidance has been provided to all such contacts.
