Ffigyrau Covid-19

Mae Iechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru wedi cyhoeddi ar 14 Ebrill mai nifer yr achosion o'r coronafeirws wedi'u cadarnhau yng Nghymru yw **210,681**. Cyfanswm yr achosion ym Mhowys ar 14 Ebrill yw **4,146**. Yn ôl ffigurau a gyhoeddwyd gan y Swyddfa Ystadegau Gwladol ar nifer y rhai fu farw ym Mhowys yn llwyr neu'n rhannol o ganlyniad i COVID-19, wedi'u cofrestru hyd at 10 Ebrill oedd **266** – 82 mewn cartrefi gofal, 12 gartref, un mewn hosbis a 171 yn yr ysbyty.

Dyma'r wythnos gyntaf heb unrhyw farwolaethau yn gysylltiedig â COVID-19 ers mis Hydref.

Diweddariadau Llywodraeth Cymru

- **Profion mewn ysgolion** Mae profion llif unffordd yn cael eu cynnig i staff a ddysgwyr o Flwyddyn 10 ac i fyny. Mae ysgolion a lleoliadau yn cael eu darparu gyda mwy o hyblygrwydd i'w galluogi i ymestyn y cynnig gwirfoddol hwn i ddysgwyr o Flwyddyn 7 ac i fyny. Mae nifer y profion llif unffordd sydd ar gael yn cael eu cynyddu i gefnogi'r ehangiad hwn, gan ddechrau o'r wythnos yn dechrau 19 Ebrill.
- **Mae pobl yng Nghymru sy'n methu gweithio gartref yn cael eu hannog i ddefnyddio hunan-broffion llif unffordd** Mae'r rheini sy'n methu gweithio gartref yn cael eu hannog i gael pecynnau hunan-brofi dyfeisiau llif unffordd wrth iddynt gael eu cyflwyno ar draws Cymru. Nifer yr unigolion yng Nghymru sydd wedi derbyn y dos cyntaf o frechlyn COVID-19 ar 11 Ebrill yw **1,588,499**. Mae nifer y bobl ym Mhowys sydd wedi cael eu dos cyntaf dros **80,500** ac mae **26,300** wedi derbyn eu hail-ddos.

Covid-19 figures

Public Health Wales has reported as of April 14 the confirmed number of coronavirus cases in Wales is **210,681**. The total number of cases for Powys as at April 14 stands at **4,146**.

Figures issued by the Office of National Statistics (ONS) on the number of deaths in Powys attributed, either wholly or in part to COVID-19, registered up to April 10 was **266** – 82 in care homes, 12 at home, one in a hospice and 171 in hospital.

This is the first week with no COVID-19 related deaths since October.

Welsh Government updates

- **Testing in schools** Lateral flow tests (LFTs) are being offered for staff and learners from Year 10 upwards, schools and settings are being provided with greater flexibility to enable them to extend this voluntary offer to learners from Year 7 upwards. The number of LFTs available is being increased to support this expansion, starting from week commencing 19 April.
- **People in Wales who cannot work from home encouraged to use lateral flow self-tests** All those who cannot work from home are being encouraged to access lateral flow self-test kits as they are rolled out across Wales. The rapid coronavirus testing kits will be available to collect from local test sites across Wales from Friday 16 April. <https://gov.wales/people-wales-who-cannot-work-home-encouraged-use-lateral-flow-self-tests>

Individuals in Wales who have received first dose of COVID-19 vaccine as at April 11 stands at **1,588,499**. The number Powys people who have had their first dose stands at more than **80,500** with second dose numbers standing at **26,300**.
