

Minutes of the Community Council Meeting held at the Hundred House Hall,
Hundred House on Wednesday 21st February 2018

Minutes: Minutes of the previous meeting were signed and confirmed as a true record.

Current Issues:

None.

Correspondence:

An e-mail was received from PCC stating that bin collection days in Powys are to change for most households in March. This is done to improve the waste and recycling collection rounds to make them more efficient and to reduce the cost of providing these services to residents.

Received from One Voice Wales was an invitation to attend the Brecon and Radnor Area Committee meeting but no members were able to attend.

Received from PCC were details of the new "Plans for Powys Schools" policy. Received was the link to the report highlighting the improvements needed in the provision of non-emergency patient transport by the Board of Community Health Councils (CHC's) in Wales – <http://bit.ly/2EeYc3n> This is to be looked at and discussed at the next meeting.

Received from PCC were details of the Yellow Triangle Scheme which is a scheme that could help emergency services find possible life-saving information about a driver in an accident. It gives drivers the opportunity to display a means of quickly determining the driver's details in the event of a collision. The scheme has a yellow triangle sticker displayed in the windscreen and a "Your details" card with details of the drivers next of kin, medical conditions, allergies and medications.

Details have been received about plans to introduce electrical vehicle charging points in council-owned car parks. The Capital Strategy for 2018-23 includes £200,000 for electrical charge points.

An Independent Review Panel has been set up to consider the future role of Community and Town Councils. It will explore the role of local government below Local Authority councils, define the most appropriate models and structures to deliver the role and consider how these should be applied across Wales.

Finance:

Received was an invoice for £216 for the hire of Hundred House Hall from April 2016 to November 2017.

Received was an invoice for £78 for membership to One Voice Wales.

Received was an invoice for £366.92 for payroll services from PCC.

Received was remittance advice for £99.40 and £48.26 for recycling on Hundred House Common.

The revenue grant for £350 was given to Hundred House Hall and £50 to Glascwm Hall.

The bank statements for the Business Premium Account shows funds of £124.76 and The Community Account show funds of £4343.74.

Planning:

Notification was received that planning application P/2017/0078 dwelling in Glascwm was heard at the committee meeting on the 21.02.17 and it has been passed.

Highways Issues:

The road between Bettws and the back road to Penybont is in a poor state of repair.

Also the road between Howey and Hundred House has numerous potholes on it.

There are a number of trees overhanging on Wernhalog pitch.

Any Other Business:

A number of trees around Glascwm village have fallen down in the winter weather and it has been decided to ask PCC to do a tree inspection of the trees around the village on below the church.
